"Nobody wants to go to rural places," Shoffner said, even though the need is great for health services.

So why did she choose the KWC?

"We really care about our patients. The entire staff cares," Shoffner said.

Jones understands the sentiment too.

"It makes my heart feel so big because this is where I grew up. These are my cousins, people I see every week and people that know my children or my family members," she said.

Mecum agreed.

When asked the same question, he answers sincerely, "I love working for my Tribal family."

Love for Tribal Family Inspires Members to Join Wellness Center Team

t used to be a rare thing.

It still is in Indian Country. But the Coquille Indian Tribe keeps quietly defying the odds and creating its own blueprint of what's normal. Our Tribe's new normal includes a wellness center with Native American health professionals.

In the dental field, "Only about one percent of Native Americans have someone from their tribal community working on them in the dentist's chair," Dental Health Aid Therapist (DHAT) and Coquille Tribal member Jason Mecum said.

Walk into the Ko-Kwel Wellness Center's (KWC) Dental Clinic and you might be greeted by Mecum or his Tribal cousin, Dental Assistant Alexandria Jones, who is working on getting her DHAT license in Oregon.

Pain brought Jones into dentistry.

"Growing up on the reservation, we never had the opportunity to be seen at a tribal clinic other than for medical and I went through a lot of dental work that was extremely painful. I never wanted my kids to experience that trauma which is why I got into dental," Jones said.

From an early age, Jones was taught by her grandfather, Calvin Summers, that it was her responsibility to give back and work for the Tribe. When she got the chance to be trained as DHAT in Alaska, she took it.

"Going to school in Alaska and knowing I would work for our people made my grandpa proud of me, but it is also very self-fulfilling to know I have the privilege to make an impact in my very own Tribal members lives," Jones said.

She credits the example of strong Coquille women for her success.

"I was surrounded by strong women within our Tribe that had a large impact on my upbringing. When you idolize those types of women it makes you want to be just as successful," Jones said.

She's not the only successful Coquille woman in the KWC. Tribal

member Mariah Shoffner became a Doctor of Pharmacy in August 2023 and works in the KWC Pharmacy.

"I really like having the time to talk with patients," Shoffner said of her KWC experience. "In retail pharmacy, or community pharmacy, you have to work quickly. Here, you have time to sit down in the consulting room and talk to somebody or call them and let them know their prescription is ready."

Shoffner was one of the few students from her graduating class who chose a rural location to live and work in.
