## Rehab and Fitness Center Edges Closer to Completion

Work continues on Shishda Haws, the Ko-Kwel Wellness Center's rehabilitation and fitness center being constructed on the Kilkich Indian Reservation in Coos Bay.

The 8,912 sq. ft. space will provide areas for physical therapy, massage, and chiropractic services; a large fitness classroom; and a generous equipment area for cardio, exercise, rehabilitation and weight equipment. There will also be a small grab-and-go deli, bouldering

wall, and covered multi-use court for basketball, volleyball, pickleball, and four square.

A soft-surface pedestrian path, natural play areas, and a fenced playground are also planned. Shishda Haws will be accessible to all Coquille Tribal members, CIT employees, KWC patients, and residents of the Kilkich community.

The project is scheduled for completion at the end of 2024.

# **Epic and MyChart Premiere in April**

On April 1, 2024, Ko-Kwel Wellness Centers (KWC) will transition to Epic and MyChart, which is a state-of-theart electronic health record (EHR) and patient portal that will significantly improve the patient experience at our KWC locations.

The Epic EHR system will increase efficiency for our providers, simplify your access to important health records, and support continuity of care when referring to outside facilities. Epic offers seamless sharing of patient chart notes and health information between KWC and specialists, hospitals, and providers locally, regionally, and nationwide.

Epic is a comprehensive medical records platform. That means it holds your lab results from the hospital, your x-rays from the orthopedic center, and your last check up at KWC with your Primary Care Provider all in one secure location. Epic's patient portal, MyChart, is user-friendly and built for patients to easily navigate to the information they want.

With MyChart, you can securely access your health records and test results, send messages to your medical team, look up bills, and request prescription refills. All from your computer or your cell phone.

Implementing a new EHR system is a significant undertaking for any healthcare organization. KWC has been preparing for the Epic change



over for over a year. Teams have been working behind the scenes with Epic project managers and consultants to document workflows and user training for providers, clinical staff, and administration.

We are excited to begin using Epic and MyChart, but there will undoubtedly be challenges as staff become familiar with new functions and screens as part of their patient care routine. Please provide a little extra time during April when checking in to your appointments at KWC. 

## **Happy 2nd Birthday to KWC Dental Clinic**

Time flies when you are having fun! February marked the two-year anniversary of the Ko-Kwel Wellness Center (KWC) Dental Clinic in Coos Bay, and it's a good time to celebrate how far we've come. Previously, Coquille Indian Tribe had no dental services, and in just 24 months the KWC Dental Team has completed more than 4,500 client appointments.

Behind this accomplishment are three providers who have been here from the start: Dr. Mary Williard, Dentist; Danielle Underwood, Dental Hygienist; and Jason Mecum, our Dental Therapist who is a also a Coquille Tribal member. Staff retention and stability is great for continuity of care. Our providers care and enjoy strengthening their relationship with every patient and the community.

The trust they've established isn't by accident. These providers and the support staff are educated in trauma informed care and are well versed in working with patients who are afraid of dental care. The providers work together to provide a range of general practice services including sealants, cleanings, deep cleanings, fillings, extractions, crown and bridges, and dentures. The Dental Clinic also has nitrous oxide gas available, but patients taking certain medications may not qualify for administration of the gas in the KWC clinic. Talk to your provider if you have questions.

The Dental Clinic is proactive, encouraging children to come for a "happy visit" as soon as their first tooth comes in. These visits allow us to get the kids used to visiting the dentist and help the family learn how to keep their children's teeth healthy. Positive oral health habits (Continued on back)
